# 6. Teacher Representative Report – Melissa Polizzi

- Teacher/Parent Interviews on October 27, 2022

  - School will be using the same system this year, however feedback from parents on this year's interviews will be appreciated and a review to follow.

# 7. Guest Speaker - Public Health Nurse Presentation – Christina Soar

- Health services pulled during COVID, now back to normal
- Using previous health model
- More funding available
- Increase in personnel
- Focus on prevention and heath issues, not as first aid

- Programs/Activities must be approved by the board
- Size of the programs/activities will be up to the community
- Support available from Christina, available every Thursdays at Bishop Ryan.

## 8. Follow-up on outstanding Business arising from September minutes - Principal

#### • #5 - Guidance issues

- Larger volume of guidance appointments (500 more than usual)
- Feedback from guidance department, a small amount was legitimate (switch career path)
- Bulk of the appointments were to switch lunch or to be with friends
- o In person appointments were thought to limit the number to lunch/friend requests
- This strategy did not work, next year booking online will be an option

## • #6 - Why were there timetable changes

- Conflicts Program may have changed due to rare courses being scheduled at the same time
- Most of the conflicts were addressed
- Goal is to address within first 10 days of the start of the course
- Some experiences were positive

# Guidance Instagram Post, comments deemed inappropriate

- o Posting is optional by all departments, but a good channel for communication
- Need to improve, but infrastructure is not there
- No moderation of comments, however, the current solution for this is now only the department head will post and edit
- Can information be posted to Instagram "feed" instead of Instagram "Story" as it is difficult to share information to Parent FB page.

- Suggestion will be reviewed
- School is reviewing many Instagram accounts, which are not accepted board platforms.
   These accounts are found to be setup by many individuals (students/teachers/others)
- o There is a need to reign in these accounts, but it is a difficult battle
- Possible to ask certain accounts to be removed
